Recommended Action: Authorization to accept a grant from the Department of Transportation, Federal Aviation Administration, (FAA) Airport Improvement Program (AIP) for Engineering Services for the update of the Pavement Management Plan at the Joplin Regional Airport and, amending the Annual Budget of the City of Joplin for the Fiscal Year 2017-2018 as adopted by Ordinance 2017-167 on October 16, 2017; and, containing an emergency clause.

**Background:** The engineering firm of Crawford, Murphy & Tilly, Inc. is currently amending the Master Plan for the Joplin Regional Airport. This amendment includes the airfield geometry changes reflected from the construction of the new Taxiway C & F project along with the reconfiguration of the priorities of the five-year Capital Improvement Program (CIP).

As part of this process there is a need to update the Pavement Management Plan to document the new pavement construction. We also need to document the impact that the commercial airline equipment upgrade (heavier aircraft) is having on the existing pavement.

**Discussion:** The FAA has issued a Go Letter for the project for the Federal share up to \$95,000. The City Council approved the design agreement with Crawford, Murphy & Tilly, Inc with Council Bill 2018-120 on June 18, 2018. This Grant funding is based on a 95/5 Federal/Local share. The CMT contract is a Lump Sum of \$98,120.00. The Federal share will be \$93,213 and the Local share will be \$4,907.00.

**Recommendation:** Staff acceptance of this grant from the Department of Transportation, Federal Aviation Administration, (FAA) Airport Improvement Program (AIP) for Engineering Services for the update of the Pavement Management Plan on an emergency basis per section 2.12(6) of the Joplin Home Rule Charter.
