

**JOPLIN CITY COUNCIL  
DECEMBER 17, 2018 MEETING MINUTES**

**CALL TO ORDER**

The regular meeting for the Joplin City Council was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mayor Gary Shaw.

**INVOCATION** read by City Clerk Barbara Gollhofer.

**PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE** to the United States of America was led by Mr. Brown.

**ROLL CALL** – Answering Roll Call were Council Members: Taylor Brown, Melodee Colbert-Kean, Doug Lawson, Anthony Monteleone, Diane Reid Adams, Gary Shaw, Ryan Stanley, Phil Stinnett and Jim West. Also, in attendance were City Manager Sam Anselm and City Attorney Peter Edwards.

**PRESENTATIONS**

Clifford Wert gave an update on the Capital Campaign for the Harry M. Cornell Arts & Entertainment Complex. To date, the total pledged amount from 100 donors is \$12,279,805, which is 88% of the \$14 million minimum goal. The amount of cash received to date is \$2,899,000. Mr. Wert also requested to extend the deadline to raise the remaining amount of the goal to June 1, 2019. The request is a Memorandum of Understanding, which is on the agenda for the city council to consider.

Mr. Lawson introduced Council Bill No. 2018-161 - an ordinance approving a construction agreement with Springfield Striping for Parking Lots and Trails Sealing 2019 in the not to exceed amount Forty-Nine Thousand Four Hundred Sixty-Two and 36/100 Dollars (\$49,462.36) for the 2019 Parking Lots and Trails Sealing 2019 and containing an emergency clause. Motion by Mr. Lawson, second Mrs. Reid Adams that Council Bill No. 2018-161 be approved on an emergency basis. Voting in favor were Council Members: Brown, Colbert-Kean, Lawson, Monteleone, Reid Adams, Shaw, Stanley, Stinnett, and West, 9. Nays: 0. 9 The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2018-174.**

Mr. Stanley introduced Council Bill No. 2018-163 - an ordinance approving a Purchase Order to be issued to Fabick Cat in the amount of One Hundred Ten Thousand Eight Hundred and no/100 Dollars (\$110,800.00) for the purchase of a replacement backhoe as budgeted in the Annual Budget of the City of Joplin for the Fiscal Year 2018-2019 and containing an emergency clause. Motion by Mr. Stanley, second by Mr. Stinnett that Council Bill No. 2018-163 be approved on an emergency basis. Voting in favor were Council Members: Brown, Colbert-Kean, Lawson, Monteleone, Reid Adams, Shaw, Stanley, Stinnett, and West, 9. Nays: 0. The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2018-175**.

Mr. Stinnett introduced Council Bill No. 2018-164 - an ordinance approving a Purchase Order to be issued to Tag Truck Enterprises of Missouri LLC in the amount of Three Hundred Ninety-Two Thousand Six Hundred Twenty-Seven and 74/100 Dollars (\$392,627.74) for the purchase of a 2 dump trucks with snow plows as budgeted in the Annual Budget of the City of Joplin for the Fiscal Year 2018-2019 and containing an emergency clause. Motion by Mr. Stinnett, second by Mr. West that Council Bill No. 2018-164 be approved on an emergency basis. Voting in favor were Council Members: Brown, Colbert-Kean, Lawson, Monteleone, Reid Adams, Shaw, Stanley, Stinnett, and West, 9. Nays: 0. The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2018-176**

Mrs. Reid Adams introduced Council Bill No.2018-524 -an ordinance approving a request to appoint Tereasa Edwards to the Board of Directors of the Northpark Lane Community Improvement District; and containing an emergency clause. Motion by Mrs. Reid Adams, second by Mr. Stanley that Council Bill No. 2018-524 be approved on an emergency basis. Voting in favor were Council Members: Brown, Colbert-Kean, Lawson, Monteleone, Reid Adams, Shaw, Stanley, Stinnett, and West, 9. Nays: 0. The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2018-177**.

#### **ORDINANCES – FIRST READING**

Mr. Monteleone introduced Council Bill No. 2018-027 - an ordinance authorizing the City of Joplin to amend the Memorandum of Understanding and Agreement with Connect2Culture previously approved as Ordinance 2017-149 for the purpose of extending timeframes and authorizing the City Manager to execute the same by and on behalf of the City of Joplin. Motion by Mr. Monteleone, second by Mr. Lawson that Council Bill No. 2018-027 be passed on First Reading and advanced to Second and Third Reading. Voting in favor were Council Members: Brown, Colbert-Kean, Lawson, Monteleone, Reid Adams, Shaw, and Stinnett, 7. Nays: West, 1. Absent: 0. Abstention: Stanley, 1. The Council Bill was read as **Council Bill No. 2018-027**.

Mr. Stanley introduced Council Bill No. 2018-275 - an ordinance authorizing the City council to issue the abatement of ad valorem taxes to real property located in the Joplin Area Enhanced Enterprise Zone; generally described as located at 2205 S. Prigmore Rd. and owned by Crossroads Realty, LLC. Motion by Mr. Stanley, second by Mr. West that Council Bill No. 2018-275 be passed on First Reading and advanced to Second and Third Reading. Voting in favor were Council Members: Brown, Colbert-Kean, Lawson, Monteleone, Reid Adams, Shaw, Stanley, Stinnett, and West, 9. Nays: 0. The Council Bill was read as **Council Bill No. 2018-275**.

Mr. West introduced Council Bill No. 2018-416 -an ordinance approving an Agreement between the City of Joplin, Missouri, and Economic Security Corporation of Southwest Area that pertains to 2018 HOME funds; authorizing the City Manager or his designee to execute same on behalf of the

City. Motion by Mr. West, second by Mr. Brown that Council Bill No. 2018-416 be passed on First Reading and advanced to Second and Third Reading. Voting in favor were Council Members: Brown, Colbert-Kean, Lawson, Monteleone, Reid Adams, Shaw, Stanley, Stinnett, and West, 9. Nays: 0. The Council Bill was read as **Council Bill No. 2018-416**.

### **Ordinances – Second Reading and Third Reading**

Mr. Stanley introduced Council Bill No. 2018-026 - an ordinance approving a plan for an industrial development project consisting of the acquisition and installation of manufacturing equipment, authorizing the city of Joplin, Missouri to issue its taxable industrial revenue bonds in a principal amount not to exceed \$67,215,000 and approving certain related documents and actions. Motion by Mr. Stanley, second by Mr. Monteleone that Council Bill No. 2018-026 be passed on Second Reading, advanced to Third Reading and passed. Voting in favor were Council Members: Brown, Colbert-Kean, Lawson, Monteleone, Reid Adams, Shaw, Stanley, Stinnett, and West, 9. Nays: 0. The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2018-178**.
