SUMMARY

This Council Bill changes certain existing fees in the fire department.

BACKGROUND

The City recently completed the biennial user fee review, which was discussed with City Council at the budget work session on September 24, 2019. User fees are fees for services for specific users. User fees should recover most of the related cost of providing the service, so general taxes are not supporting services for specific users. Under Hancock provisions, the City is only allowed to recover the cost of providing the service. As detailed in the biennial user fee review, certain user fees need to be increased to recover more of the costs associated with providing these services.

In the fee review, staff proposed various changes to fire department fees.

The proposed changes are as follows:

- Change the fire operational permit from \$50.00 to \$75.00
- Change the fireworks stand fee from \$100.00 to \$150.00

The fee changes will be effective on January 1, 2020.

FUNDING SOURCE

This revenue is included in the fiscal year 2020 general fund budget.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends this council bill be approved on first reading.

AN ORDINANCE repealing Section 58-68, Schedule of Fees, Article II, Fire Prevention Code, Division 2, International Fire Code, of Chapter 58, Fire Prevention and Protection, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Joplin and enacting in lieu thereof a new Section 58-68, Schedule of Fees, Article II, Fire Prevention Code, Division 2, International Fire Code, of Chapter 58, Fire Prevention and Protection, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Joplin to implement certain fee changes; and setting a date when this Ordinance shall become effective.

WHEREAS, the City performed the biennial fee review and the cost of services has increased and exceeds revenues; and,

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Joplin desires to increase fees to meet the reasonable expenditures of this function; and,

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Joplin desires to change certain fees to better reflect services provided by the fire department.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Joplin, Missouri, as follows:

Section 1. That Section 58-68, Schedule of Fees, Article II, Fire Prevention Code, Division 2, International Fire Code, of Chapter 58, Fire Prevention and Protection, be repealed and a new Section 58-68, Schedule of Fees, Article II, Fire Prevention Code, Division 2, International Fire Code, of Chapter 58, Fire Prevention and Protection of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Joplin be enacted in lieu thereof to read as follows:

"ARTICLE II. FIRE PREVENTION CODE

DIVISION 2. INTERNATIONAL FIRE CODE

Sec. 58-68. Schedule of Fees.

The following is a schedule of the fire department permit fees:

- (1) *Plan Review.* Where a fire plan review is required for any reason, fees shall be collected for such plan review as follows:
 - a. *Fire Commercial Plan Review* fee shall be .001 multiplied by the value of the project, with a maximum cap of \$2,500.00 per plan review.
 - i. The value of the project in this section shall be computed by one of the following methods and approved by the Fire Marshal, but in no case shall the value of the project be less than the minimum set forth in this section.

- a) Provided by the person applying for the permit and verified by the Fire Marshal.
 - b) Calculated using the Building Valuation Data published in the Building Safety Journal each February issue (on file in the City Clerk's office) based on square footage of the project, and modified for the City of Joplin, using a multiplier of 0.87.
 - ii. The minimum value of the project shall be calculated using the Building Valuation Data published in the Building Safety Journal each February issue (on file in the City Clerk's office) based on square footage of the project, and modified for the City of Joplin, using a multiplier of .65.
 - b. *Sprinkler/Standpipe Plan Review* fee shall be \$200.00 for commercial permits and \$50.00 for residential permits.
 - c. *Alarm System Plan Review* fee shall be \$200.00 for commercial permits and \$50.00 for residential permits.
- (2) *Inspection Fees.* Where an inspection for an underground sprinkler system or a hood suppression system is required for any reason, fees shall be collected as follows:
- a. *Underground Sprinkler Inspection* fee shall be \$100.00 for commercial permits.
 - b. *Hood Suppression Inspection* fee shall be \$75.00 for commercial permits.
- (3) *Permit Fees.* No permit will be issued prior to the plan review process or prior to the beginning of construction.
- a. *Operational Permit fee.* Operational permits, as referenced in the International Fire Code, may be revoked by the Fire Marshal at any time for cause. Operational permits shall be \$75.00 per permit.
- (4) *Burn Permit Fees.*
- a. *General Burn Permit Fee.* A general burn permit shall be issued prior to any such burning inside the City of Joplin. A general burn permit for piles less than 3 feet diameter by 2 feet high shall cost \$10.00. A burn permit shall be valid for up to three consecutive days. Prior to burning, a holder of a valid burn permit must contact the Joplin Fire Department to obtain permission to burn on that given day.
- (5) *Reinspection Fees.*
- a. There will be a reinspection fee when extra inspections are necessary due to any of the following reasons:
 - 1) When wrong address is provided.
 - 2) When work is not ready for inspection when called.

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- 3) When work is not installed in compliance with city ordinances and/or applicable codes
- 4) In any other event that is of no fault of city inspectors.

For each trip, residential: \$25.00, commercial/industrial: \$50.00.

(6) *Firework Stand Fees.*

- a. \$150.00 per calendar year as referenced in Section 58-66.

(7) *Fee Review Process.*

City Council shall review the costs of services with all user fees at least on a biennial basis during the budget process to determine the appropriateness of the fees charge."

Section 2. That this ordinance shall become effective on January 1, 2020.
