SUMMARY

This council bill approves the contract by and between the City of Joplin and with Gator Industrial to remove the structures, and any remaining debris including foundation and footings 2107 Murphy Ave.

BACKGROUND

The above listed address was “tagged” as a dangerous building on November 26, 2019. The structures were determined to be dangerous under sub sections of the Dangerous Building Code (Section 26-612, Joplin City Code). On July 24, 2020, an advertisement for bids was published in the Joplin Globe with bids being received on August 7, 2020 for the removal of structures and any remaining debris including footings and foundations. At that time bids were received as follows.

Gator Industrial	\$3,795.00
B & D Yardbuilders	\$5,900.00
Big Johns	\$4,500.00
Nelson Enterprises (Withdrew Bid)	\$3,150.00

A Special Tax Bill will be issued after the demolition is completed. The Special Tax Bill acts as a lien against the property until it is paid, with the owner having five years to pay off the assessment. The bill also is a personal debt of the owner.

FUNDING SOURCE

These payments are included in the FY 2019-20 budget of the Revolving Fund.

RECOMMENDATION

City Staff recommends that the demolition removal contract be awarded to Gator Industrial for \$3,795.00 and that it be approved on an emergency basis within the meaning of section 2.12 (1) for the immediate preservation of public health and welfare.
