

**JOPLIN CITY COUNCIL
NOVEMBER 15, 2021
MEETING MINUTES**

CALL TO ORDER

The November 15, 2021 regular meeting of the Joplin City Council was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mayor Ryan Stanley.

INVOCATION was read by City Clerk Barbara Gollhofer.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE TO THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA was led by Mr. Copple.

ROLL CALL

Answering Roll Call were Council Members: Charles Copple, Keenan Cortez, Anthony Monteleone, Gary Shaw, Diane Reid Adams, Mayor Ryan Stanley, Phil Stinnett, and Christina Williams. Absent: Doug Lawson. Also, in attendance were City Manager Nick Edwards and Assistant City Attorney Jordan Paul. Motion by Mr. Monteleone, second by Mr. Cortez to excuse Mr. Lawson. Voting in favor were Council Members: Copple, Cortez, Monteleone, Shaw, Stanley, Stinnett, and Williams, 8. Nays: 0.

PRESENTATIONS

RAISE (Refugee And Immigrant Services & Education) Update was presented by Mike Newman. Mr. Newman gave an overview of the Afghan Placement and Assistance Program and how it involves the resettling of 50 people to Joplin through the RAISE organization.

FINALIZATION OF CONSENT AGENDA

There being no further business to come the Council, the Consent Agenda was finalized.

REPORTS AND COMMUNICATIONS

Health Department Update: Health Director Ryan Talken reported Covid numbers have remained relatively flat since September. There are 60 active cases and 23 hospitalizations, of which 82% are unvaccinated. Statewide there is a slight increase of cases. The Health Dept. has administered 5,621 vaccines. Joplin/Jasper County has a vaccine completion rate of 43.4%; statewide vaccine completion is at 50%. There are three upcoming walk-in vaccine clinics scheduled for November 16, November 18, and December 2 at the Health Department.

Response & Recovery Plan Update

City Manager Nick Edwards asked the City Council to consider ending the Response and Recovery Plan. He stated the City has adequately restored their PPE supply and based on what we know today, he feels the organization is prepared to face another pandemic. We do need to improve internet connectivity for services such as Telemed. The hospitals are prepared as well. The health dashboard on the website will continue to be maintained. Motion by Mr. Monteleone, second by Dr. Reid Adams to exit the Response and Recovery Plan. Voting in favor were Council Members: Cortez, Monteleone, Reid Adams, Shaw, Stanley, Stinnett, and Williams, 7. Nays: Copple, 1. Absent: Lawson, 1.

The Residential Leaf Pick Up Program begins Monday, November 29. Residents need to rake their leaves to the curb. The [Leaf Pick-Up map](#) indicates the order of neighborhoods the crews

will be picking up leaves and it's posted on the City's website. By using the map, citizens can better prepare for their arrival to pick up their leaves. The program can take about a month or longer depending on the weather.

Joplin Youth Council members are kicking off the holiday season with a Literacy event and invites families out to enjoy arts and crafts along with reading books related to Thanksgiving. This reading activity is from 4 to 6 p.m. on Thursday, November 18 at the Joplin High School Library. Families with children from about age 3 to 10 are encouraged to join them for this unique opportunity. Members also ask people to bring a book to donate that will be passed along to organizations working with children and reading.

The Joplin Recycling Center will host a shredding event on Saturday, November 20 at the Recycling Center located at 1310 West A Street. During this recycling event, large amounts of paper can be shredded quickly at no cost to area residents. Midwest Fibre Sales will have their mobile shred truck at the Center from 8 a.m. to 10 a.m. this Saturday for residents to rid themselves of personal papers that are no longer needed without worry of identity theft. This free event is sponsored by the City's Recycling Division, Region M Waste Management District, and the Missouri Department of Natural Resources.

Downtown Joplin Alliance is hosting their Annual Holiday Window Display contest as vendors decorate their storefronts for the upcoming season starting Thursday, November 18. Be sure to get downtown to view them and vote for your favorite windows. Voting ends December 17 and the awards will be announced on December 22.

Spiva Park will be lit up starting November 18. Stop by any evening after 5:30 p.m. to enjoy the beautiful lights and holiday music, brought to you by the Joplin Parks & Recreation Department.

The kickoff event for the Holiday Tree Trail will be held from 6 to 8 p.m. on Tuesday, November 30. There will be entertainment, refreshments, and an appearance from Santa. Mr. Copple introduced Resolution No. 2021-021 - a resolution establishing a "Proposition Action Implementation and Oversight Committee". Motion by Mr. Copple, second by Mr. Stinnett to amend Section 5 of the Resolution by replacing the word "may" with the word "shall". *That the Capital Oversight Committee ~~may~~ shall be tasked with the financial oversight for the Use Tax and the tax dollars are collected and deployed.* Voting in favor were Council Members: Copple, Reid Adams, Shaw, Stinnett, and Williams, 5. Nays: Cortez, Monteleone, and Stanley, 3. Absent: Lawson, 1. The amendment was approved.

Motion by Mr. Stinnett, second by Mr. Copple to amend Resolution No.2021-021 to increase the number of members to 13 with two alternates and add a Section 7 to state the Resolution will terminate April 1, 2025.
