SUMMARY

The Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission has issued this Second Supplemental Airport Aid Agreement for Thirty-Five Thousand Five Hundred Sixteen and no/00 Dollars (\$35,516.00) for the completion of the Relocation of the GA Entrance Road.

BACKGROUND

One of the items addressed in the new Airport Master Plan was improvement to the General Aviation (GA) Terminal Area by reconstructing the GA entrance road. After the move of the Commercial operations to the Main Terminal in 2007 there needed to be a structured plan as to how we would address the transition of the GA Terminal Area. We have a Fixed Base Operator (FBO) and an increase in GA Transient traffic that is driving the demand for improvement to this area. The original Airport Aid Agreement was approved on council bill 2020-132 for \$944,624.00. The level of funding was not sufficient to cover the costs associated with the project. Final costs for this project will be paid from this Aid Agreement based on a 90/10 State/Local share. The Local Share will be approximately Three Thousand Nine Hundred Ninety-Two no/100 Dollars (\$3,992.00).

FUNDING SOURCE

Airport Budget.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends adoption of this Council Bill on an Emergency basis, being an ordinance dealing with a general appropriation, within the meaning of Section 2.12(4) of the Home Rule Charter of the City of Joplin, Missouri, and, as such, this Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage. Specifically, this council bill needs to be approved in order to accept grant funding within time limitations and meet MoDOT timelines.
