

**JOPLIN CITY COUNCIL
APRIL 15, 2019 MEETING MINUTES**

CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting of the Joplin City Council was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mayor Gary Shaw.

INVOCATION was read by City Clerk Barbara Gollhofer.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE to the United States of America was led by Mr. Cortez.

ROLL CALL

Answering Roll Call were Council Members: Taylor Brown, Melodee Colbert-Kean, Keenan Cortez, Doug Lawson, Anthony Monteleone, Diane Reid Adams, Gary Shaw, Ryan Stanley, and Phil Stinnett. Also, in attendance were Interim City Manager Dan Pekarek and City Attorney Peter Edwards.

PRESENTATIONS

Mayor Gary Shaw presented a proclamation naming April 14-20, 2019 as Public Safety Telecommunicators Week to Public Safety Communications Manager Cheryl Konarski. Also in attendance were April Ford, Director of JASCO Communications; Stephanie Welch, City of Joplin Emergency Communications Dispatcher; and Police Chief Matt Stewart.

FINALIZATION OF CONSENT AGENDA

There being no further business to come before the City Council, the Consent Agenda was finalized.

REPORTS AND COMMUNICATIONS

The FY2018 Annual Audit Report was presented by Michael Keenan of Cochran, Head and Vick. Mr. Keenan thanked the City of Joplin for the opportunity to serve as their auditor. He also thanked Finance Director Leslie Haase and the Joplin staff for their professionalism in assisting with the audit. Mr. Keenan reported the auditors encountered no difficulties in dealing with management in performing and completing the audit.

Before reviewing the annual reports, Finance Director Leslie Haase recognized and thanked her assistant, A.J. Whistler and the rest of her staff for the work they do, not just on the audit, but all year long. She also thanked the City overall for their job performance that resulted in a good audit report. The Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) reflects everything the City is doing. She stated it is a great accomplishment to have no comments on the single audit and no comments on the regular audit.

Finance Director Leslie Haase reviewed the Joplin Sports Authority annual report; City of Joplin Policemen's and Firemen's Pension Plan Actuarial report; and TIF status report.

CITIZEN REQUESTS AND PETITIONS

PUBLIC HEARINGS

Public Hearing Procedures read by City Clerk Barbara Gollhofer

Public Hearing - appeal for Denial of Historic Preservation Commission Case Number 2019-02.

City Attorney Peter Edwards explained this public hearing is an evidentiary hearing.

Planning and Community Development Director Troy Bolander stated the purpose of the hearing is to review the denial of a certificate of appropriateness by the Historic Preservation Commission for the proposed installation of windows of the type and design the HPC believes does not review the Design Review Standards for the Sunshine Lamp District, which was adopted by the City Council in 2005.

Properties in the Historic Sunshine Lamp District require Certificates of Appropriateness on file in the Building Department before pulling building permits. To obtain certificate, property owners consult with City Staff, and obtain applications for certificates of appropriateness from the Planning, Development and Neighborhood Services Department. Upon submittal of an application, staff reviews the application and confirms whether the scope of work is classified as major or minor works. Staff review of the application is conducted in accordance with the Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Historic Rehabilitation and referencing the local Design Review Standards for the Sunshine Lamp District. Minor works can be approved by staff. Major works, and minor works not approved by staff are sent to the Design Review Board. The Design Review Board makes a recommendation on approval or denial of the work to be performed. The Historic Preservation Commission then makes a determination on the historic appropriateness on the scope of work outlined in the application. If the Certificate of Appropriateness is approved, permits may be obtained.

Application for a Certificate of Appropriateness for work proposed on a building located at 218 S. Main was received by the Planning Department on February 22, 2019. Staff reviewed the application, determined the scope was minor works but unable to approve through staff review due to finding windows to be inappropriate. Staff convened an emergency meeting of the Design Review Board on February 27, 2019. Design Review Board unanimously found the proposed windows to be inappropriate and passed a recommendation to the Historic Preservation Commission to deny certificate. On March 19, 2019 the Historic Preservation Commission reviewed the application and recommendation from the Design Review Board and denied the application for Certificate of Appropriateness.

The property owners, ACL Holdings, LLC, are appealing the denial of the Certificate of Appropriateness to City Council in accordance with Appendix B, Historic Preservation, of the Joplin Zoning Code of Ordinances. City Council has the final administrative determination on the historic appropriateness of the proposed work.

City Attorney Edwards asked questions pertaining to Design Review standards and rules of Historic Preservation.

Tom Walters, City Planner and staff representative to the Historic Preservation Commission, and Jill Sullivan, Executive Director of the Post Art Library and Chairperson of the Historic Preservation Commission presented testimony on behalf of the HPC.

Luke Sheafer and his wife presented a power point testimony on behalf of ACL Holdings, LLC, as part of their appeal to the denial of the certificate of appropriateness. After the presentation and

discussion, they thanked the Council for their time and consideration in this matter.

Mr. Edwards stated he would offer Resolution 2005-043 the Design Review Standards, all the photos that were reviewed tonight, the staff packet that was identified as Exhibit 2, to the City Council as evidence for this public hearing. The Council accepted the evidence. The Council needs to decide if the proposed windows meet the Design Standards for the Sunshine Lamp Historic District

Motion by Mr. Stinnett, second by Mrs. Reid Adams for the denial of Case 2019-02. Voting in favor were Council Members: Brown, Cortez, Monteleone, Reid Adams, Shaw, Stanley and Stinnett, 7. Nays: Colbert-Kean; Lawson, 2.

Mr. Brown stated he had the opportunity to make a movie for his place of employment that involved using the canine unit at the Joplin City Police Dept.


