News from Public Information Officer, Lynn Onstot

Officials with Missouri Southern State University and the City of Joplin will celebrate the completion of Joplin's newest walking trail with a Ribbon Cutting at 10 a.m. this Friday, September 10. The City and MSSU worked together to create a convenient connection from Missouri Southern's campus to the northeast side of Northpark Mall complex. The 10-foot-wide asphalt trail accommodates both foot and bicycle traffic among a beautiful setting. A 90-foot pedestrian bridge was constructed to provide a safe and dry crossing over Turkey Creek just south of MSSU's biology pond and soccer fields. If planning to attend this event, parking will be near the trail entrance and tennis courts, which is behind Leggett & Platt Athletic Center on Missouri Southern's campus. Guests will get to enjoy a short walk on the trail to the bridge, where the ribbon cutting will take place.

Richard Hatfield stated the new subdivision would affect the integrity of the neighborhood. Gayle Podleski disagreed that the Plat meets the City's zoning regulations, and she stated her reasons.

Tera Miller stated the increased number of homes would make the area unsafe.

John Lewandowksi feels the current property owners are not benefitting from this project. He would like to see fewer homes on larger lots.

Jerod Huebner questioned the size of the detention basins, which could cause poor drainage. He questioned the engineers' value of the homes. He also stated Amber Road cannot be used as an access road.

Roger Bartlett feels they have no fair city representation.

Barbara Joe complained of drainage issues.

Ken Myers stated he had concerns for traffic issues and the width of Par Lane. He invited the council members to drive through the neighborhood so they could understand his concerns.

Mark Lane is concerned for the safety of the neighbors due to increased traffic; streets aren't wide enough for emergency vehicles, and he feels the project was a bait and switch project.

Alex Kendall stated the streets are too narrow; there will be issues due to increased traffic, and school buses can't drive on Par Lane.

Michael Poiry stated the area has been a suburban setting for over 30 years and the project would be detrimental to property values.
