

COUNCIL BILL NO. 2021-145

ORDINANCE NO

AN ORDINANCE approving the City of Joplin to enter into a construction agreement with Southwest Missouri Traffic Management Inc., in the amount of Two Hundred Twenty-Five Thousand Two Hundred Thirty and 00/100 Dollars (\$225,230.00) for construction of the 10th and Main Culvert Replacement project; and authorizing the City Manager or his designee to execute the same by and on behalf of the City of Joplin; and containing an emergency clause.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JOPLIN, as follows:

Section 1. That the said construction agreement by and between the City of Joplin and Southwest Missouri Traffic Management Inc., in the amount of Two Hundred Twenty-Five Thousand Two Hundred Thirty and 00/100 Dollars (\$225,230.00) for construction of the 10th and Main Culvert Replacement project funded through the Parks and Stormwater Sales Tax, in the City of Joplin, Jasper County, a true and accurate copy of said agreement being attached hereto and incorporated herein, be, and the same is hereby approved.

Section 2. That the City Manager of the City of Joplin, Missouri, or his designee, is hereby authorized and directed to execute said agreement, or agreement in substantially similar form, by and on behalf of the City of Joplin.

Section 3. That upon the final approval and acceptance of the contractor's work under said contract, in substantial conformance with the attached agreement, in writing by the Director of Public Works and his certification to the effect to the Director of Finance, the contractor shall be paid from the Parks and Stormwater Sales Tax fund.

Section 4. That the City of Joplin hereby declares that this ordinance relating to a public improvement, is an emergency within the meaning of Section 2.12(6) of the HOME RULE CHARTER of the City of Joplin, Missouri, and as such, this ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage. Specifically, approval of this council bill on an emergency basis will allow for the City to secure material prices under the current volatile market, as well as ensure fabrication of the 72" RCP in expedient fashion to allow for completion of project during the winter months ahead of the spring rains.
