SUMMARY

This Council Bill authorizes an agreement by and between the City of Joplin and Crawford, Murphy & Tilly, Inc., for Engineering Design Services for the Terminal Area Master Plan (TAMP) in the not to exceed amount of Five Hundred Twelve Thousand and 00/00 Dollars (\$512,00.00).

BACKGROUND

This grant funds the TAMP that is intended to update the Terminal planning for the changes in airline service and fleets that have occurred in the last few years. The increase in aircraft size at JLN has put pressure on the current hold rooms and changes in security requirements have caused some space to be re-utilized in ways that are sub-optimal. After the Runway 13-31 rehabilitation, Terminal Improvements are the next highest priority for projects that were identified in the Airport Capital Improvement Program process last year. This document will help determine what improvements are necessary and provide justification to pursue funding.

This grant is based on a 95/5 Federal /Local share. The Federal share will be \$486,400.00 and the local share will be \$25,600.00 for a total project cost of \$512,000.00.

FUNDING SOURCE

Airport Fund.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends adoption of this Council Bill on an Emergency basis, being an ordinance related to public improvement, within the meaning of Section 2.12(6) of the Home Rule Charter of the City of Joplin, Missouri, and, as such, this Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage. Specifically, this Council Bill needs to be approved in order to allow the design services to be completed within funding time limitations.
