The December 19, 2022, regular meeting of the Joplin City Council was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mayor Doug Lawson.

News from the Public Information Office

In recognition of the Christmas and New Year's holidays, the City of Joplin offices will be closed on Monday, December 26, and Monday, January 2, since the holidays fall on a Sunday. This closing includes MAPS transportation service and the Joplin Recycling Center, which will also be closed on Saturday, December 24, and Saturday, December 31.

Public safety services (Police and Fire Departments), airport operations, and wastewater treatment operations will continue to operate throughout the Christmas and New Year's holidays, as these departments run 24/7 throughout the year.

City offices, MAPS, and the Recycling Center will open and resume their regular operating hours on Tuesday, December 27, following Christmas weekend, and Tuesday, January 3, after the New Year's holiday.

Due to the holiday closures, the Joplin City Council meeting will be moved to Tuesday, January 3, 2023.

Residential trash service and curbside recycling schedules stay the same this year since the holiday falls on a Sunday.

With 2023 fast approaching, so will Joplin Sesquicentennial. We will be back in early January with details of events the Joplin Celebrations Commission is planning.

We are happy to announce VBBA – Vintage Base Ball Association will play an exhibition game in April. They are to baseball what Civil War reenactors are to preserving Civil War era history. The Westerns Base Ball Club of Topeka will play the St. Louis Brown Stockings at historic Joe Becker Stadium. Before and after the vintage will be high school varsity games.

Connor Ave. in the City of Joplin, Missouri, for Two Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty-Nine dollars (\$2,759.00); providing how the cost thereof shall be paid; how the assessment thereof shall be made; and containing an emergency clause. Motion by Mr. Copple, second by Dr. Farnham that Council Bill No. 2022-542 be passed on an emergency basis. Dr. Farnham introduced Council Bill No. 2022-614 - AN ORDINANCE approving a Purchase Order to be issued to Motorola Solutions, Inc. in the amount of Three Hundred Ninety-Four Thousand, Seven Hundred Ninety-Five Dollars and 83/100 Dollars (\$394,795.83) for the purchase of portable and mobile radios; and containing an emergency clause. Motion by Dr. Farnham, second by Ms. Spencer that Council Bill No. 2022-614 be passed on an emergency basis. Voting in favor were Council Members: Copple, Cortez, DeTar, Farnham, Lawson, Shaw, Spencer, and Stinnett, and Williams 9. Nays: 0 The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2022-192**.

Mr. Stinnett introduced Council Bill No. 2022-158 - AN ORDINANCE approving the City of Joplin to enter into a construction agreement with Joplin Industrial Electric Inc. in the amount of Seventy-Eight Thousand, Five Hundred Fifty-Seven and 00/100 Dollars, (\$78,557.00) for the 1st Floor Remodel project; and authorizing the City Manager or his designee to execute the same by and on behalf of the City of Joplin. Motion by Mr. Stinnett, second by Mr. Shaw that Council Bill No. 2022-158 be passed on the first reading and advance to second and third. Voting in favor were Council Members: Cortez, DeTar, Farnham, Lawson, Shaw, Stinnett, Spencer, and Williams, 8. Nays: Copple, 1. The Bill was read as Council Bill No. 2022-158.

COUNCIL BILL NO. 2022-403

Mr. Stinnett introduced Council Bill No. 2022-403 - AN ORDINANCE approving an Agreement between the City of Joplin, Missouri, and the Homeless Coalition that pertains to 2022 CDBG public service grant funds; authorizing the City Manager to execute same on behalf of the City. Motion by Mr. Stinnett, second by Mr. Copple that Council Bill No. 2022-403 be passed on the first reading and advance to second and third. Voting in favor were Council Members: Copple, Cortez, DeTar, Lawson, Shaw, Stinnett, Spencer, and Williams, 8. Nays: Farnham, 1. The Bill was read as Council Bill No. 2022-403.

COUNCIL BILL NO. 2022-404

Mr. Copple introduced Council Bill No. 2022-404 - AN ORDINANCE approving an Agreement between the City of Joplin, Missouri, and the Economic Security Corporation that pertains to 2022 CDBG public service grant funds; authorizing the City Manager to execute same on behalf of the City. Motion by Mr. Copple, second by Mr. Cortez that Council Bill No. 2022-404 be passed on the first reading and advance to second and third. Voting in favor were Council Members: Copple, Cortez, DeTar, Lawson, Shaw, Stinnett, Spencer, and Williams, 8. Nays: Farnham, 1. The Bill was read as Council Bill No. 2022-404.

COUNCIL BILL NO. 2022-543

Mr. Cortez introduced Council Bill No. 2022-543 - AN ORDINANCE approving a Memorandum of Understanding by and between the City of Joplin and Missouri Southern State University (MSSU) to provide One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars and No Cents (\$1,500,000.00) from the City's allocation of State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF) as a part of the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds for the construction of a new Health Science Innovation Center. Motion by Mr. Cortez, second by Mr. DeTar that Council Bill No. 2022-543 be passed on the first reading and advance to second and third. Voting in favor were Council Members: Copple, Cortez, DeTar, Farnham, Lawson, Shaw, Stinnett, Spencer, and Williams, 9. Nays: 0. The Bill was read as Council Bill No. 2022-543.
