Impaired Driving Enforcement Projects will consist of one or more officers who will patrol and seek out impaired drivers in high alcohol and/or drug related crash areas during the hours and days of peak impaired driving. Funding will be provided for overtime or dedicated manpower, and support personnel such as dispatchers, and may be provided for equipment if the need is demonstrated.

Hazardous Moving Violation (HMV) Enforcement Projects will target high crash locations and areas where consistent HMVs occur. Projects will be developed from the analysis of specific traffic problems occurring in your community and the resulting problem identification. Funding will be provided for overtime or dedicated manpower, and support personnel such as dispatchers, and may be provided for equipment if the need is demonstrated. Hazardous violations are Improper Turn; Follow to Close; Stop Sign; Traffic Signal; Failure to Yield; Careless Driving; Red Light Running; Speeding; School Bus Stop Arm; etc. HMV projects can also address distracted driving and enforcement projects to specifically reduce bicycle & pedestrian fatalities.

Occupant Protection Projects should be designed to increase safety belt use and to increase and promote the proper use of child safety seats. These projects may include activities such as child safety seat or safety belt events and safety fairs. Funding will be for officer overtime. Educational materials may be available through the Highway Safety and Traffic Division. Community involvement is highly recommended.

Youth Alcohol Enforcement Projects will consist of one or more officers patrolling high alcohol-related crash areas during the hours and days of peak alcohol usage. The purpose of the patrol will be to use probable cause to stop and arrest underage (under 21) impaired drivers, check for alcohol compliance at local business and other deterrence programs. Funding for this type of project will be for officer overtime; funding can also be used to pay undercover buyers.
