SUMMARY

Approval of an Ordinance authorizing the acceptance of the 2023 Public Transportation Agency Safety Plan annual safety targets. Approval of the annual PTASP safety targets are required by the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) regulations set in 49 CFR Part 673 of the federal guidelines.

BACKGROUND

PTASP regulation implements a risk-based Safety Management System approach and requires recipients or subrecipients of financial assistance under FTA's Urbanized Area Formula Program, (49 U.S.C. Section 5307)(1) to establish and certify that they have an Agency Safety Plan in place that meets statutory requirements. PTASP regulations require the establishment of annual safety targets for the following categories: Fatalities, Injuries, Safety Events, System Failures, and System Reliability.

RECOMMENDATION

City staff recommends approval of Council Bill 2023-135 on First Reading to approve the 2023 Public Transportation Agency Safety Plan Safety Targets.

System Reliability is the miles between Major Failures

Fatalities: Person dies at the scene or at medical facility a short time later due to injuries caused by the accident.

Injuries: Person is injured and is transported from the scene to receive medical aid.

Safety Event: Medical assistance is requested on the vehicle for a non-injury medical event, rider falls outside the vehicle in the right-of-way and medical assistance is requested, or police assistance is requested because of an angry rider.

System Failure: Mechanical failure of one or more systems on the vehicle that makes it unable to continue on its route. The vehicle was towed to receive repairs and the route schedule was negatively impacted by 30 minutes or more.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE authorizing the approval of the 2023 Public Transportation Agency Safety Plan (PTASP) Safety Targets for the City of Joplin, MO, Metro Area Public Transit System (MAPS) and Sunshine Lamp Trolley. BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Joplin, Missouri, as follows:

Section 1. That the City of Joplin, Missouri, shall approve the proposed 2023 Public Transportation Agency Safety Plan (PTASP) Safety Targets for the City of Joplin, MO, Metro Area Public Transit System (MAPS) and Sunshine Lamp Trolley as detailed in (exhibit A).

Section 2. That the City of Joplin, Missouri, understands that the Public Transportation Agency Safety Plan (PTASP) Safety Targets will be updated and approved on an annual basis.
