SUMMARY

Summary sheet This Council Bill authorizes the City Manager or his designee to enter into an agreement with G&G Construction Co., Inc. in the to be contracted amount of One Hundred Ten Thousand Nine Hundred Ninety-One and 80/100 Dollars (\$110,991.80) for construction services on the Turkey Creek WWTF Leachate Aerial Crossing project.

BACKGROUND

This agreement consists of the removal and replacement of concrete piers supporting an aerial sewer crossing including streambank improvements with rip-rap, armored embankment, seeding and mulching, and miscellaneous site work. Streambank improvements are included to prevent future erosion and bank failures around the aerial crossing.

In accordance with the City of Joplin's procurement policies, a request for bid proposal was advertised in the Joplin Globe on June 28th, 2023, and bids were received by the City on July 18th, 2023. Three bids were received, with G&G Construction being the apparent low bidder. The bid was below the engineer's estimate. The Notice to Proceed will be issued once signed contract documents have been received and executed.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends approval of Council Bill 2023-149, Construction Agreement between the City of Joplin and G&G Construction for Construction services for the Turkey Creek Wastewater Treatment Facility (WWTF) Leachate Aerial Crossing in the amount of One Hundred Ten Thousand Nine Hundred Ninety-One and 80/100 Dollars (\$110,991.80) on an emergency basis, in that said ordinance provides for public improvements and is an emergency per section 2.12(6) of the HOME RULE CHARTER of the City of Joplin, Missouri, and as such, this ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage. Furthermore, approval of this council bill as an emergency will allow the contractor to enter into agreements for material orders sooner, to lessen the chance for delays to the project due to supply chain issues.
