CALL TO ORDER

The January 2, 2024, regular meeting of the Joplin City Council was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mayor Doug Lawson.

News from the Public Information Office

If citizens want to know more about the Joplin Police Department, they have a great opportunity to enroll in the upcoming Citizens Police Academy. Offered as a 14-week program, the Academy is FREE of charge and provides an interactive, behind-the-scenes program taught by police officers.

The classes are every Thursday evening starting February 1 from 6 to 9 p.m. The Citizens Academy ends on May 2 with a closing ceremony and dinner. The class size is limited to 25 participants. Applicants must be 21 years or older and pass a background check. If interested, citizens can contact the Police Department or go to the Police Department's website at joplinpolice.org.

If wanting to learn something new this year, the Joplin Health Department offers CPR classes throughout the year as a part of the American Heart Association's training. Doctors have stated administering CPR outside the hospital can save thousands of lives annually, but about half of Americans say they don't know how to do it.

The next classes are scheduled for Thursday, January 18. AHA Heartsaver CPR and AED training is scheduled from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. and trains participants to give CPR and use an automated external defibrillator (AED) in a safe, timely, and effective manner. Students receive a certification upon completion. Fee for the course is \$50 per person.

AHA HeartCode® BLS Skills Checkoff will be held from 10 to 11 a.m. on January 18, and is designed for those who have already completed the online portion of the HeartCode® BLS course. This is the hands-on skills session check-off to complete the certification for HeartCode® BLS. Cost is \$20 per person.

Preregistration and pre-payment are required to attend either of these classes. Participants can complete these steps by going to the [Joplin Parks registration website](https://joplinparks.org) at joplinparks.org.

Motion by Mr. Copple, second by Mr. DeTar that Council Bill No. 2024-103 be passed on an emergency basis. Mr. DeTar introduced Council Bill No. 2024-350 - AN ORDINANCE approving the contract by and between the City of Joplin and USA Demolition for the demolition of the structure(s) and clearing of a lot located at 926 S Chestnut Ave. in the City of Joplin, Missouri, for Five Thousand Four Hundred Ninety-Five dollars (\$5,495.00); providing how the cost thereof shall be paid; how the assessment thereof shall be made; and containing an emergency clause. Motion by Mr. DeTar, second by Mr. Stinnett that Council Bill No. 2024-350 be passed on an emergency basis. Mr. DeTar introduced Council Bill No. 2024-351 - AN ORDINANCE approving the contract by and between the City of Joplin and USA Demolition for the demolition of the structure(s) and clearing of a lot located at 1202 S Jackson Ave. in the City of Joplin, Missouri, for Four Thousand Three Hundred Ninety-Five dollars (\$4,395.00); providing how the cost thereof shall be paid; how the assessment thereof shall be made; and containing an emergency clause. Motion by Mr. DeTar, second by Mr. Copple that Council Bill No. 2024-351 be passed on an emergency basis. Motion by Mr. Stinnett, second by Mr. Cortez that Council Bill No. 2024-500 be passed on an emergency basis. Voting in favor were Council Members: Copple, Cortez, DeTar, Farnham, Lawson, Monteleone, Shaw, Stinnett, and Williams, 9. Nays: 0. The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2024-010**.

COUNCIL BILL NO. 2024-600

Mr. Copple introduced Council Bill No. 2024-600 - AN ORDINANCE authorizing the City of Joplin, Missouri, to enter into an Agreement with Higginbotham Inc., for the purpose of professional brokering and other loss control services not to exceed price of Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$60,000.00) per year, for a three (3) year contract term; authorizing the City Manager to execute the same by and on behalf of the City of Joplin; and containing an emergency clause. Motion by Mr. Copple, second by Mr. Monteleone that Council Bill No. 2024-600 be passed on an emergency basis. Voting in favor were Council Members: Copple, Cortez, DeTar, Farnham, Lawson, Monteleone, Shaw, Stinnett, and Williams, 9. Nays: 0. The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2024-011**.

The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2024-012**.


