If citizens are interested in getting outside with their pets, we encourage them to check out the City's Dog Park. Located at Joplin's Parr Hill Park in the area of 18th and Kansas Avenue, it is a fenced facility for dogs to go off-leash to run, play, socialize, and exercise. Yearly registration is required to use the dog park. The fee is \$10 for the first pup and \$5 for an additional pup. Mr. Copple introduced Council Bill No. 2023-108 - AN ORDINANCE authorizing the acceptance of a supplemental agreement by and between the City of Joplin and Crawford, Murphy & Tilly, Inc., in the amount of ninety-five thousand six hundred thirty-eight and 27/100 dollars (\$95,638.27) for Engineering Design Services for the Snow Removal Equipment (SRE) storage portion of the Aircraft Rescue and Fire Fighting (ARFF) Building at the Joplin Regional Airport; amending the Annual Budget of the City of Joplin for the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 as adopted by Ordinance 2022-161 on October 17, 2022; and, containing an emergency clause. Motion by Mr. Copple, second by Dr. Farnham that Council Bill No. 2023-108 be passed on an emergency basis. Voting in favor were Council Members: Copple, Cortez, DeTar, Farnham, Lawson, Shaw, Spencer, and Stinnett, and Williams 9. Nays: 0. The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2023-019.**

Mr. Cortez introduced Council Bill No. 2023-504 - AN ORDINANCE amending the Annual Budget of the City of Joplin for the Fiscal Year 2021-2022 as adopted by Ordinance 2021-149 on October 18, 2021, to adjust appropriations and containing an emergency clause. Motion by Mr. Stinnett, second by Mr. DeTar that Council Bill No. 2023-504 be passed on an emergency basis. Voting in favor were Council Members: Copple, Cortez, DeTar, Farnham, Lawson, Shaw, Spencer, and Stinnett, and Williams 9. The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2023-020**.

Mr. Shaw introduced Council Bill No. 2023-004 - AN ORDINANCE approving a plan for an industrial development project consisting of the acquisition, construction, and improvement of warehouse facilities; authorizing the City of Joplin, Missouri to issue its taxable industrial development revenue bonds in a principal amount not to exceed \$20,200,000 to finance the costs of the first phase of such project; authorizing and approving certain documents; and authorizing certain other actions in connection with the issuance of the bonds. Motion by Mr. Shaw, second by Ms. Spencer that Council Bill No. 2023-004 be tabled. Voting in favor were Council Members: Copple, Cortez, DeTar, Farnham, Lawson, Shaw, Stinnett, Spencer, and Williams, 9. Nays: 0. The Bill was tabled.

COUNCIL BILL NO. 2023-258

Mr. Stinnett introduced Council Bill No. 2023-258 - AN ORDINANCE establishing grades and accepting the Final Plat of Par Lane 2nd Addition located at property West of S Twin Hills Dr and South of W Par Ln, in the City of Joplin, Jasper County, Missouri. Motion by Mr. Stinnett, second by Mr. Copple that Council Bill No. 2023-258 be passed on the first reading and advance to second and third. Voting in favor were Council Members: Copple, Cortez, DeTar, Farnham, Lawson, Shaw, Stinnett, Spencer, and Williams, 9. Nays: 0. The Bill was read as Council Bill No. 2023-258.

COUNCIL BILL NO. 2023-450

Mr. Copple introduced Council Bill No. 2023-450 - AN ORDINANCE authorizing the purchase of a health vehicle for mobile medical services from TriVan Truck Body, LLC, a Washington Limited Liability Company, for the amount of One Hundred Thirty-Four Thousand Thirteen and 00/100 Dollars (\$134,013.00); authorizing the City Manager to execute the same by and on behalf of the City of Joplin, Missouri; amending the Annual Budget of the City of Joplin for the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 as adopted by Ordinance 2022-161 on October 17, 2022; and, containing a contingency clause. Motion by Mr. Copple, second by Mr. Cortez that Council Bill No. 2023-450 be passed on the first reading and advance to second and third. Voting in favor were Council Members: Copple, Cortez, DeTar, Farnham, Lawson, Shaw, Stinnett, and Williams, 8. Nays: Spencer, 1. The Bill was read as Council Bill No. 2023-450.

Mr. Copple introduced Council Bill No. 2022-601 - AN ORDINANCE authorizing the City of Joplin, Missouri, to enter into an Agreement with Conventions, Sports & Leisure International, LLC, a Delaware Limited Liability Company, for the purpose of conducting a Tourism Venue Needs Assessment of the Joplin tourism market for the not to exceed price of One-Hundred and Eleven Thousand Six Hundred and Eight and 00/100 Dollars (\$111,608.00); amending the Annual Budget of the City of Joplin for the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 as adopted by Ordinance 2022-161 on October 17, 2022; authorizing the City Manager to execute the same by and on behalf of the City of Joplin; and, setting a date when this Ordinance shall become effective. Motion by Mr. Copple, second by Ms. Williams to pass Council Bill No. 2020-601 on Second Reading, advance to Third Reading and pass. Voting in favor were Council Members: Copple, Cortez, DeTar, Lawson, Shaw, Stinnett, Spencer, and Williams, 8. Nays: Farnham, 1. The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2023-021**.


NEW BUSINESS
