News from the Public Information Office

Have a teen getting behind the wheel soon? Check out First Impact, a 90-minute traffic safety program that educates parents and teen drivers about Missouri's Graduated Driver's License law. The program is designed to reduce the number of motor vehicle

fatalities, injuries and accidents among teen drivers by increasing parental awareness and enforcement of Missouri's GDL law.

The City of Joplin Health Department is hosting this program on Thursday, March 2 from 6 PM to 7:30 PM at the Joplin Public Library. Registration is required. The Joplin Area Chamber of Commerce reported last week that Joplin has been identified as one of the nation's best locations for remote workers according to The Wall Street Journal's list "Top 10 Places for Remote Workers."

These findings were based on a national study of remote workers who identified characteristics that make a city ideal for remote work. Available data on each of these factors was gathered for metropolitan areas across the country and then compared against the weighted results of the study.

Medical professionals echo the call for more people to learn CPR after thousands watching a national football league game witnessed Damar Hamlin's cardiac arrest on the field and how quickly CPR was administered to assist him through the medical crisis. Doctors have stated administering CPR outside the hospital can save thousands of lives annually, but about half of Americans say they don't know how to do it.

To help those of us in the Joplin area, our Joplin Health Department offers CPR classes on a regular basis for the public. Classes are a part of the American Heart Association's training. There are two classes of CPR scheduled for Thursday, March 16 at the Joplin Public Library.

The Friends and Family® CPR will be held from 1 to 4 p.m. that day, and is a great class for new parents, grandparents, babysitters, and others. Cost is \$25 per person.

AHA HeartCode® BLS Skills Checkoff will be held from 10 to 11 a.m. on March 16, and is designed for those who have already completed the online portion of the HeartCode® BLS course. This is the hands-on skills session check-off to complete the certification for HeartCode® BLS. Cost is \$20 per person.

Preregistration and pre-payment are required to attend either of these classes. Participants can complete these steps by going to the Joplin Parks registration website at [joplinparks.org](http://joplinparks.org).

She's an instrumental part of Joplin's Parks and Recreation Department.

Another important role in Parks and Recreation is the maintenance work needed to manage the 930-plus acres of park land we have in Joplin. Staff members who work countless hours keeping our parks beautiful were also recognized at their conference, because Joplin Parks and Rec entered a team in the State's Parks and Recreation Maintenance Rodeo & Joplin took First Place in the competition!

The challenges in the rodeo included events that demonstrated the skills they use on a daily basis. Categories were: A Backpack Blower contest, a Truck and Trailer obstacle course, Skid Loading, Zero-turn Mowing and Project Assembly.

Mr. Copple introduced Council Bill No. 2023-105 - AN ORDINANCE approving a construction agreement with Jeff Asbell Excavating & Trucking, Inc. in the amount of One Million, Four Thousand, Eight Hundred Eighty-two and 53/100 Dollars (\$1,004,882.53) for the East Town Infrastructure – Sanitary Sewer, Phase 2 project, authorizing the City Manager or his designee to execute the same by and on behalf of the City of Joplin; amending the Annual Budget of the City of Joplin for the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 as adopted by Ordinance 2022-161 on October 17, 2022; and, containing an emergency clause. Motion by Mr. Copple, second by Mr. DeTar that Council Bill No. 2023-002 be passed on an emergency basis. Voting in favor were Council Members: Copple, Cortez, DeTar, Farnham, Lawson, Shaw, Stinnett, and Williams 8. Nays: 0 Absent: Spencer, 1. The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2023-027**.

COUNCIL BILL NO. 2023-602

Dr. Farnham introduced Council Bill No. 2023-602 - AN ORDINANCE approving a Contract for grant money by and between the City of Joplin, Missouri and the Missouri Department of Transportation dealing generally with the Full Time DWI Unit, Hazardous Moving Violations Enforcement, and DWI Enforcement in the amount of One Hundred Twenty-Four Thousand, and Twenty Dollars (\$124,020.00); authorizing the City Manager to execute the same by and on behalf of the City of Joplin, Missouri; and containing an emergency clause. Motion by Dr. Farnham, second by Mr. Cortez that Council Bill No. 2023-602 be passed on an emergency basis. Voting in favor were Council Members: Copple, Cortez, DeTar, Farnham, Lawson, Shaw, Stinnett, and Williams 8. Nays: 0 Absent: Spencer, 1. The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2023-028**.

Mr. DeTar introduced Council Bill No. 2023-603 - AN ORDINANCE approving a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) by and between the City of Joplin and the Joplin Area Chamber of Commerce to participate in a partnership with the Joplin Regional Alliance for Health Care and Health Science and approving a contribution of \$80,000.00 for the purpose of pursuing an economic development plan. Motion by Mr. DeTar, second by Dr. Farnham that Council Bill No. 2023-603 be passed on the first reading and advance to second and third. Voting in favor were Council Members: Copple, DeTar, Farnham, Lawson, Shaw, Stinnett, and Williams 7. Nays: 0 Absent: Spencer, 1. Abstain: Cortez, 1. The Bill was read as Council Bill No. 2023-603.

Motion by Dr. Farnham, second by Mr. Copple to pass Council Bill No. 2020-450 on Second Reading, advance to Third Reading and pass.
