Within this work, trees are also being assessed for risk in City Parks, by identifying the structural condition of the trees for potential failure.

Mr. Cortez introduced Council Bill No. 2023-510 AN ORDINANCE approving a Petition to Establish the 32nd Street Theatre Community Improvement District and creating the 32nd Street Theatre Community Improvement District; approving a Cooperative Agreement among the City of Joplin, Missouri, the 32nd Street Theatre Community Improvement District, the 32nd Street Place Community Improvement District, and Woodsonia Joplin, LLC; authorizing the City Manager to execute the Agreement on behalf of the City of Joplin; and containing an emergency clause. Motion by Mr. Cortez, second by Mr. Detar to continue the public hearing on the establishment of the proposed 32nd Street Theatre Community Improvement District to the City Council meeting beginning at 6:00 p.m., on June 5, 2023, in the City Council Chambers at City Hall, 5th Floor. The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2023-064**.

COUNCIL BILL NO. 2023-269 - AN ORDINANCE amending Ordinance No. 2022-274, passed by the Council of the City of Joplin, Missouri, August 1, 2022, by removing from District R-3 (Apartment House) to R-3 HP (Apartment House, Historic Preservation) property as described below and located at 216 N Wall Ave. The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2023-066**.

Mr. Cortez introduced Resolution No. 2023-008 - A RESOLUTION of the City of Joplin, Missouri, authorizing the City to enter into an American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Subrecipient Agreement with Jasper County through the State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF) Program to purchase the MOSWIN, or Missouri Statewide Interoperability Network System. Motion by Mr. Cortez, second by Mr. Shaw that Resolution No. 2023-008 be passed. Voting in favor were Council Members: Cople, Cortez, DeTar, Farnham, Lawson, Shaw, Spencer, Stinnett, and Williams, 9. Nays: 0.

ORDINANCES – EMERGENCY**COUNCIL BILL NO. 2023-121**

Mr. Cortez introduced Council Bill No. 2023-121 - AN ORDINANCE authorizing the City of Joplin to enter into an agreement with Infrastructure Solutions, Inc., in the amount of Three Million Six Hundred Forty-Eight Thousand Six Hundred Eight and 00/100 Dollars (\$3,648,608.00) for the Baker's Branch East Wastewater Extension project; authorizing the City Manager or his designee to execute the same by and on behalf of the City of Joplin; and containing an emergency clause. Motion by Mr. Cortez, second by Dr. Farnham that Council Bill No. 2023-121 be stricken from the agenda. Voting in favor were Council Members: Cople, Cortez, DeTar, Farnham, Lawson, Shaw, Spencer, Stinnett, and Williams, 9. Nays: 0. This item was stricken.

COUNCIL BILL NO. 2023-507

Mr. Cople introduced Council Bill No. 2023-507 - AN ORDINANCE approving a Contract by and between the City of Joplin and Motorola Solutions, Inc. to provide Missouri Statewide Interoperability Network System (MOSWIN) on behalf of the Joplin Police Department; authorizing the City Manager to execute said Contract by and on behalf of the City of Joplin; and, Amending the Annual Budget of the City of Joplin for the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 as adopted by Ordinance 2022-161 on October 17, 2022; and, containing an emergency clause. Motion by Mr. Cople, second by Ms. Spencer that Council Bill No. 2023-507 be passed on an emergency basis. Voting in favor were Council Members: Cople, Cortez, DeTar, Farnham, Lawson, Shaw, Spencer, Stinnett, and Williams, 9.

Nays: 0. The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2023-067.**

COUNCIL BILL NO. 2023-508

Mr. DeTar introduced Council Bill No. 2023-508 - AN ORDINANCE approving a Contract by and between the City of Joplin and Guidehouse Inc. for a performance time extension to provide ARPA-Infrastructure related assistance; authorizing the City Manager to execute said Contract by and on behalf of the City of Joplin; and, containing an emergency clause. Motion by Mr. DeTar, second by Mr. Cople that Council Bill No. 2023-508 be passed on an emergency basis. Voting in favor were Council Members: Cople, Cortez, DeTar, Farnham, Lawson, Shaw, Spencer, Stinnett, and Williams, 9. Nays: 0. The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2023-068.**

Mr. Copple introduced Council Bill No. 2023-008 - AN ORDINANCE amending Chapter 10 – Alcoholic Beverages, Article I – In General, by enacting a new Section 10-19 – Prohibition of shooters.

COUNCIL BILL NO. 2023-405

Mr. Cortez introduced Council Bill No. 2023-405 - AN ORDINANCE approving an Agreement between the City of Joplin, Missouri, and The Southwest Missouri Community Alliance that pertains to CDBG-CV public service grant funds; authorizing the City Manager to execute same on behalf of the City. Motion by Mr. Cortez, second by Mr. Shaw that Council Bill No. 2023-405 be passed on the first reading and advance to second and third. Voting in favor were Council Members: Copple, Cortez, DeTar, Farnham, Lawson, Shaw, Spencer, and Stinnett, 8. Nays: 0. Abstained: Williams, 1. The Bill was read as Council Bill No. 2023-405.

SECOND AND THIRD READING**COUNCIL BILL NO. 2023-506**

Mr. Cortez introduced Council Bill No. 2023-506 - AN ORDINANCE adopting a new step pay plan by reference the City Salary Administration Plan; establishing the annual salary of certain Classified and Unclassified positions and Part-Time/Seasonal positions for Fiscal Year 2022-2023; amending the Annual Budget of the City of Joplin for the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 as adopted by Ordinance 2022-161 on October 17, 2022; and, setting a date when this Ordinance shall become effective. Motion by Mr. Cortez, second by Mr. Shaw to pass Council Bill No. 2020-506 on Second Reading, advance to Third Reading and pass. Voting in favor were Council Members: Copple, Cortez, DeTar, Lawson, Shaw, and Williams, 6. Nays: Farnham, Spencer, Stinnett, 3. The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2023-069**.
