**News from the Public Information Office**

Joplin Parks and Recreation has partnered with community organization to focus on water safety and drowning prevention for children ages 5 through 12. The Show-Me Water Safety Event will be offered twice on Saturday, June 24 to teach children important life skills when they are around or in water and also will educate parents about these areas.

- Safety tips and swimming in water
- Staying healthy on the water
- Boating safety and
- Emergencies and First Aid

will be featured as the kids and their parents through these stations to receive instructions and details about each area. The kids will get into the water to practice their new skills, so they'll need to wear swimwear to the class.

A great feature of the program is that all kids will be weighed and fitted for a free U.S. Coast Guard-approved life jacket. The City will hold a Public Meeting focusing on the Tin Cup Trail project on Tuesday, June 27. This pedestrian and bike trail will follow the Tin Cup Creek, south of the Joplin Family Y. It will also connect the St. Johns Trail near Mercy Park to the trails in McIndoe Park along Shoal Creek. When completed the Tin Cup Trail will provide more than a mile of new trail in the southern portion of Joplin.

The Public Meeting will be held from 4 p.m. to 6 p.m. on Tuesday, June 27 for citizens to learn more about the project. It will be held in the community room at the Joplin Family Y, 3404 W. McIntosh Circle. This is an informal open house that allows citizens to come-and-go as their schedules allow. They can view informational displays, visit with City staff about the trail and ask questions about the project.

Parts of the trails could include creek crossings and other associated challenges. Allgeier, Martin and Associates will assist with designing this section of the trails, and their staff will also be at the meeting. The Tin Cup Trail project is funded by the Parks and Stormwater Sales Tax, which was recently renewed in 2021. And on Wednesday, June 28, CFI and Visit Joplin are co-hosts for the return to Joplin of The Great Race. 120 of road-worthy antique and classic automobiles will line the 300 to 500 block of Main Street starting at 4:30 p.m. Only cars built in 1974 and earlier can participate. Joplin is hosting the end and overnight stay as day five of the 9-day event concludes.

In all, the Great Race covers more than 2,300 miles. It starts in St. Augustine, Florida, on June 24 and the race will be completed on July 2 in Colorado Springs, Colorado. A new feature has popped up for this event - Joplin's Main Street will also have Mini Coopers lined up in the 100 and 200 blocks for car enthusiasts to enjoy. Motion by Mr. Shaw, second by Dr. Farnham that Council Bill No. 2023-129 be passed on an emergency basis. Motion by Mr. Copple, second by Mr. DeTar to amend the Council Bill by striking the communications section of Section A of the proposed ordinance. Mr. Cortez introduced Council Bill No. 2023-009 - AN ORDINANCE authorizing the City of Joplin, Missouri, to enter into a Right of Access and Construction Agreement (MOU) with East Town Dreams District for the purpose of building a park and playground for children – "HOPE PARK" – on the City's Joe Becker Stadium Clubhouse North Lot; establishing responsibilities for the East Town Dreams District and the City relating to the construction of improvements and maintenance of HOPE PARK; and, authorizing the City Manager to execute said Agreement (MOU) by and on behalf of the City of Joplin. Motion by Mr. Cortez, second by Dr. Farnham that Council Bill No. 2023-009 be passed on the first reading and advance to second and third. Voting in favor were Council Members: Cortez, Copple, DeTar, Farnham, Lawson, Shaw, Stinnett, and Williams, 8. Nays: 0. Absent: Spencer, 1. The Bill was read as Council Bill No. 2023-009.

COUNCIL BILL NO. 2023-127

Mr. Copple introduced Council Bill No. 2023-127 - AN ORDINANCE authorizing the City of Joplin, Missouri, to enter into an Intergovernmental Cooperative Agreement with the Joplin Special Roads District (JSRD), for the purpose of street construction improvements associated with the 20th Street Widening from Schifferdecker Avenue to Country Club Drive Project; authorizing the City Manager to execute the same by and on behalf of the City of Joplin. Motion by Mr. Copple, second by Mr. DeTar that Council Bill No. 2023-127 be passed on the first reading and advance to second and third. Voting in favor were Council Members: Cortez, Copple, DeTar, Farnham, Lawson, Shaw, Stinnett, and Williams, 8. Nays: 0. Absent: Spencer, 1. The Bill was read as Council Bill No. 2023-127.

Mr. Cortez introduced Council Bill No. 2023-119 - AN ORDINANCE approving an Agreement and Work Authorization with Olsson in the not to exceed amount of Eight Hundred Sixty-Three Thousand Seven Hundred Thirty-One and 00/100 dollars (\$863,731.00) for professional engineering services for the Main Street Streetscape 8th to 15th Street project and authorizing the City Manager or his designee to execute the same by and on behalf of the City of Joplin. Motion by Mr. Cortez, second by Dr. Farnham to pass Council Bill No. 2020-119 on Second Reading, advance to Third Reading and pass. Voting in favor were Council Members: Copple, Cortez, DeTar, Farnham, Lawson, Shaw, Stinnett, and Williams 8. Nays: 0 Absent: Spencer, 1. The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2023-085**.

Mr. DeTar introduced Council Bill No. 2023-271 - AN ORDINANCE approving the voluntary annexation by the Council of the City of Joplin, Missouri, of property generally located along Missouri Highway I-249 South of Newman Rd. Motion by Mr. DeTar, second by Mr. Copple to pass Council Bill No. 2020-271 on Second Reading, advance to Third Reading and pass. Voting in favor were Council Members: Copple, Cortez, DeTar, Farnham, Lawson, Shaw, Stinnett, and Williams 8. Nays: 0 Absent: Spencer, 1. The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2023-086**.
