CALL TO ORDER

The July 5, 2022, regular meeting of the Joplin City Council was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mayor Doug Lawson.

REPORTS AND COMMUNICATIONS

News from the Public Information Office

Missouri Department of Transportation has announced that the closure of the Range Line Bridge is set for Monday, July 18. This closure will be done as crews work to replace the Range Line Road bridge over Kansas City Southern Railroad just north of 32nd Street.

Access to all businesses will remain OPEN throughout the duration of the project. Drivers will need to take the designated detour routes using 32nd Street, Missouri Route 249 and 7th Street.

The bridge is scheduled to reopen by November 1. It will be closed for a maximum of 87 calendar days and MoDOT has offered a financial incentive for early completion. The current bridge was rebuilt in 1976 and approximately 24,580 vehicles cross the bridge each day. The new bridge will be two feet higher, 15 feet wider, and 27 feet shorter than the current bridge. Sidewalks on both sides of the bridge will be part of the project.

Copple, second by Mr. Cortez that Council Bill No. 2022-136 be passed on an emergency basis. Mr. DeTar introduced Council Bill No. 2022-138 - AN ORDINANCE approving a work authorization with Allgeier, Martin and Associates, Inc., for engineering consultation services not to exceed the amount of Two Hundred Sixty-Five Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$265,000.00) for Tin Cup Lift Station Facility Rehabilitation and authorizing the City Manager or his designee to execute the same by and on behalf of the City of Joplin; and containing an emergency clause. Motion by Mr. DeTar, second by Mr. Copple that Council Bill No. 2022-138 be passed on an emergency basis. Voting in favor were Council Members: Copple, Cortez, DeTar, Farnham, Lawson, Shaw, Spencer, Stinnett, and Williams, 9. Nays: 0. The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2022-112.**

Mr. Cortez introduced Council Bill No. 2022-139 - AN ORDINANCE approving a construction agreement with Goins Enterprises, Inc. for the 2022 Emergency Repairs and On-Call Sewer Contractor project; and authorizing the City Manager or his designee to execute the same by and on behalf of the City of Joplin; and containing an emergency clause. Motion by Mr. Cortez, second by Dr. Farnham that Council Bill No. 2022-139 be passed on an emergency basis. Voting in favor were Council Members: Copple, Cortez, DeTar, Farnham, Lawson, Shaw, Spencer, Stinnett, and Williams, 9. Nays: 0. The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2022-113.**

COUNCIL BILL NO. 2022-275

Mr. DeTar introduced Council Bill No. 2022-275 - AN ORDINANCE authorizing the City of Joplin to enter into an Agreement with Alvarez and Marsal Infrastructure and Capital Projects LLP to provide administrative services for developing and implementing broadband and connectivity solutions for the City of Joplin; authorizing the City Manager to execute said Contract by and on behalf of the City of Joplin; and, amending the Annual Budget of the City of Joplin for the Fiscal Year 2021-2022 as adopted by Ordinance 2021-149 on October 18, 2021 and containing an emergency clause. Motion by Mr. DeTar, second by Ms. Spencer that Council Bill No. 2022-275 be passed on an emergency basis. Voting in favor were Council Members: Copple, Cortez, DeTar, Farnham, Lawson, Shaw, Spencer, Stinnett, and Williams, 9. Nays: 0. The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2022-114.**

Mr. Stinnett introduced Council Bill No. 2022- 137 - AN ORDINANCE approving a Work Authorization AMA-OC-22-013 with Allgeier, Martin and Associates in the not to exceed amount of Ninety-Six Thousand and 00/100 dollars (\$96,000.00) for professional engineering consulting services for engineering design services associated with the Tin Cup Trail Phase II design; and authorizing the City Manager or his designee to execute

the same by and on behalf of the City of Joplin. Motion by Mr. Stinnett, second by Ms. Williams that Council Bill No. 2022-137 be passed on first reading and advance to second and third. The Bill was read as Council Bill No. 2022-137.


UNFINISHED BUSINESS
