News from the Public Information Office

The City is looking for School Crossing Guards who work with the Joplin Police Department to help students cross the street safely at designated crosswalks. This part-time position works one hour in the morning and one hour in the afternoon Monday through Friday. With back-to-school quickly approaching, Joplin Parks and Recreation has announced that Schifferdecker Aquatic Center will be open daily through Sunday, August 13, which is the last day of the pool season.

The date of the closing is determined by school calendars. Lifeguards for the aquatic center will be returning to high school or college, making late August a challenge for staffing. Joplin Parks and Recreation appreciates everyone's support and enjoyed the season with many who came to the pool this year.

And now, I guess I can say the pool is going to the dogs! Before the water is drained, Parks and Rec will hold its sixth annual Doggy Dive-In at Schifferdecker Aquatic Center on Saturday, August 19 from 10:30 am to 12 noon.

Dog owners are welcome to bring their furry four-legged friend to take a plunge in the pool. All different breeds and sizes are welcome to come and practice their dog-paddling. They can play fetch, paddle around in the shallow area, or leap off the deck for their favorite toy. While the dogs will be able to enjoy the pool, and dog owners will only be able to get in the water up to their knees.

This event is limited to the first 30 registered dogs. Registration must be done in-person at the Joplin Parks and Rec office at 3301 W. 1st Street. Owners must show a copy of their dog's updated shot records during registration to enter the dog swim. The cost is \$5 per dog or if registrants bring a product donation for the Humane Society, they will receive free admission.

Mr. Cortez introduced Council Bill No. 2023-133 - AN ORDINANCE approving an amendment (Change Order 1) to the construction agreement with Blevins Asphalt Construction Company Inc. in the amount of Two Hundred Thirty-Nine Thousand Nine Hundred Fifty-One and 80/100 Dollars, (\$239,951.80) for the Mill and Overlay 2023 project; authorizing the City Manager or his designee to execute the same by and on behalf of the City of Joplin; amending the Annual Budget of the City of Joplin for the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 as adopted by Ordinance 2022-161 on October 17, 2022; and, containing an emergency clause. Motion by Mr. Cortez, second by Mr. Copple that Council Bill No. 2023-133 be passed on an emergency basis. The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2023-112.**

COUNCIL BILL NO. 2023-142

Mr. Copple introduced Council Bill No. 2023-142 - AN ORDINANCE authorizing the City of Joplin, Missouri, to enter into an Agreement with Missouri-American Water Company, a Missouri Corporation, for the purpose of leasing certain land in the area commonly known as Grand Falls; authorizing the City Manager or his designee to execute the same by and on behalf of the City of Joplin; and containing an emergency clause. Motion by Mr. Copple, second by Ms. Williams that Council Bill No. 2023-142 be passed on an emergency basis. Voting in favor were Council Members: Copple, Cortez, DeTar, Farnham, Lawson, Shaw, Spencer, Stinnett, and Williams, 9. Nays: 0. The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2023-113**.

Motion by Mr. DeTar, second by Mr. Copple that Council Bill No. 2023-011 be passed on the first reading and advance to second and third. Voting in favor were Council Members: Copple, Cortez, DeTar, Farnham, Lawson, Shaw, Spencer, Stinnett, and Williams, 9. Nays: 0. The Bill was read as Council Bill No. 2023-011.
