News from the Public Information Office

With today's busy schedules, the City provides various options to help residents conveniently pay their utility bills as well as receive them.

Citizens can drop off their payments at the Payment Drop Box – which is now located on the west side of the alley behind City Hall. Drivers should approach the box from the south, and then exit onto 6<sup>th</sup> Street. This drop-off option is for making payments with a check or money order. Please also include payment stubs in the envelope when using this convenient option.

The City's website offers other efficiencies and online features, including the option to receive your bill via email instead of through postal mail. Citizens need to establish a user account and follow some basic instructions to begin receiving eBilling from the City and can go to [joplinmo.org/753/Online-Payments](http://joplinmo.org/753/Online-Payments) to complete this process.

Customers can also use the online payment feature on the City's website. There are no additional fees to make an online payment, and you do not have to set up an online account for a one-time payment. Or they can make their payment through a bank draft by completing a form from the Finance Department. And of course, the City still accepts mailed payments as well.

Mr. Stinnett introduced Council Bill No. 2022-454 - AN ORDINANCE approving a Program Services Contract by and between the State of Missouri, Department of Health and Senior Services, and the City of Joplin, Missouri, for a term commencing October 1, 2022 and running through September 30, 2023, for the amount of up to Thirty Three Thousand, Four Hundred Ninety-Two Dollars and Nineteen Cents (\$33,492.19), to enable the Health Department to provide maternal child health services to residents of Joplin, authorizing the City Manager to execute the same by and on behalf of the City of Joplin, Missouri; and containing an emergency clause. Motion by Mr. Stinnett, second by Dr. Farnham that Council Bill No. 2022-454 be passed on an emergency basis. The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2022-172**.

Mr. DeTar introduced Council Bill No. 2022-535 - AN ORDINANCE approving the job description for Park Ranger and the placement of the new position within the Salary Administration Plan for the City of Joplin. Motion by Mr. DeTar, second by Ms. Williams to pass Council Bill No. 2020-010 on Second Reading, advance to Third Reading and pass. Voting in favor were Council Members: Copple, Cortez, DeTar, Lawson, Shaw, and Williams, 6. Nays: Farnham, Spencer, Stinnett, 3. The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2022-173**.


**UNFINISHED BUSINESS****NEW BUSINESS**

Mr. DeTar would like to see if staff could gather data on pedestrian injuries, deaths, and traffic accidents. City Manager Edwards suggested a traffic safety study.

This meeting, record, and vote to be closed to the extent provided by law. The City Council shall adjourn at the end of the session.
